Emergency Protocol

1. First staff to discover the emergency
Assess ABCs- Airway
 Breathing
 Circulation.
Have front desk call 911 if needed.
2. Immediately return to patient. Lie patient back (supine).
Oxygen at 4 l/min.
Legs elevated if patient has fainted or is hypotensive, pale, cold, clammy.
3. Support any or all ABCs as necessary.
4. Get a blood pressure, pulse and assess further.

911 Protocol

Caller says: This is Dr. _____ office.
Our address is _____.
Be specific in describing the emergency- ie-We have a dental patient
with a heart attack, not breathing.

Designate someone to wait outside building to direct emergency personnel.

Reception staff will reassure other patients that the situation is in hand and
remove them to an out of the way area if possible- ie- staff room.
